PROGRAM

He shared with the group the method he used to remove excess material and install a bullnose on the curved edge of a hardwood step. He also challenged the group to try his techniques for making a tabletop from two pieces of wood which are joined along a curve. Russ had examples of the patterns and calculations he used for his tabletop.
