Vic had another striking intarsia piece. A deer head made of 70 pieces of wood, walnut for the face and butternut for the antlers. On the eyes he used his ebonizing technique which he shared at a previous meeting.





John Freymuth brought in the bottom step for a staircase he plans to build in a new home. The step was wide with rounded sides. He used bending techniques for the round sides and laminated the front face. Quite an interesting piece.
