Bill Frerking – Intaglio carving Intaglio carving is the reverse of relief carving. Relief carving images stand proud of the background. An intaglio image is cut away and the background stands proud. The piece Bill is showing is a grouping of individual intaglio relief carvings...each unique to itself but, like with the blocks of a quilt, together they make up an interesting, attractive display.



Bill Weise – a Kreg Jig success story

Bill used a Woodsmith project plan, air dried walnut, four 12" x 12" floor tiles and his Kreg fastener Jig, to make this attractive, sturdy and very functional plant stand/table. The table top tiles are loose (not attached) but supported underneath by multiple cross pieces. A lower slatted shelf adds structural integrity to the basic design. A walnut stain completed the worthwhile effort.
