Frustrated with his original Grizzly drill press fence attachment, **John Clark** followed a Shop Notes plan to make his own. The "table" has a ³/₄" plywood core between pieces of ¹/₄" hardboard. The fence attaches, front and back, to ¹/₄" hardwood strips. A bracket underneath attaches it as an overlay on the existing drill press table. It met John's expectation of making a drill press fence with functionality beyond that of the original.



Russ Marie made a series of cherry ornaments depicting the 12 days of Christmas. The cherry was re-sawn to 3/16, stacked and scroll sawn to the pattern. If I heard it right, he used #5 DT blades and a unique stacking technique that I lost in the din of the pounding rain. If you need that information, see Russ.
