In addition to the features and benefits of Festool's line of power sanding tools, he covered basic power sanding techniques and how to choose the right abrasives for the task. His presentation was enjoyable and informative.



**Russ Marie:** As promised, he gave us a peak at how he shop built a large clock bezel.



- (1). Draw a full size hexagon on a poster board.
- (2). Cut out and glue up the hexagon pieces.
- (3). Attach a cross beam.
- (4) Shop-build a trammel for the router.



(5). Make successive light cuts.

There is a bit more to it than can be shown here. The bezel in the photo to the right has a profile on the outside with a glass holding rabbit on the backside.

**Paul Cobb:** Paul turned these pieces over the winter. In addition to keeping himself active turning, he teaches it.



One must assume that his classes might be “advanced” if/when working out the details of these segmented bowls were part of his student’s work assignments.

The figured hard maple segments are separated with slivers of blood wood for contrast. These pictures fall short of showing the detail so worthy of appreciation.

**Vic McDonald:** Vic crafted this plaque (and others) for fellow Moose Lodge members he worked with during his term as a Lodge officer. When he first brought one in, he was searching for lighting solutions to avoid/minimize heat buildup. He found that in some led rope lights. Now he can rest easier.



**Khaled Mohammad:** Khaled made this small cheery wood planter a while ago. It has good lines, appropriate details and a good finish. Small flat stones fill the center and the small planter in the corner. It's charm is in its simplicity.



**Del & Janice Luedtke:** According to the "back-story," Del & Janice are well acquainted with this scroll sawn walnut & birch intarsia Eagle. It's the "seventh son of seven sons" ... and it was a bit larger in the beginning. Each time something happened, Del cut it entirely apart being careful to stay just within the lines. With each redo, it became a little smaller. Now, they are pretty satisfied with it and, they should be.
