**Program**: Khaled Mohammad took us through a tutorial on Google's basic version of SketchUp. It is downloadable from Google. There are free

versions and others that are "not so free. Several members already have it and more will be

#### **Show & Tell:**

John Clark: John built this fitting room mirror for his daughter-in-law. The three mirrors are well reinforced on the backside. The center mirror is mounted solidly to the base to provide vertical stability. The two side mirrors are hinged to the center mirror. The base is up on casters for necessary mobility and to add some height. When not in use, the side mirrors fold inward and the unit can be easily moved out of the way.



Del Luedtke: Del has "upped his game" with his new General Excalibur Scroll Saw. He gave us a look at one of the "puzzled angels" sawn from some well figured maple. The natural tone of the Danish oil finish further accented the wood's distinctive grain pattern.





John Freimuth: Now all of Grandpa John's grandkids have their very own rocking chairs. This one is for Anna (as one might conclude from the carving on the front). It is made from soft pine. It is sturdy, stable (resists rocking to far back) and, all sharp edges were well rounded as they should be.





Antique cut nails added a rustic touch. He wasn't sure about where they came from but they were interestingly shaped and different from any others he has used. As the nails added just the right touch to Anna's chair, it was the poly finish that presented the challenge when he tried to push the cold weather envelope just a bit. But haven't we all.



Norm Bartlett: Norm needed a Valentine's Day gift so he called upon his scroll sawing skills to make these collapsible baskets. The larger basket was sawn from <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" oak veneer plywood. The smaller one is from <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" oak. Both did collapse and open flawlessly. The small horizontal tab at the base provided upright stability.



Mark Padesky: Mark made these "heirloom scratch awls" from Woodcraft kits/plans. The kit provided the metal parts leaving the turning, fitting and finishing to Mark. He used walnut on the two darkest awls, ash on the lighter and koa on the other. Doubt any of these directly replaced his old "go to awl" just yet but, after a year/so…maybe.



**John Goodenough:** John has a new Excalibur scroll saw and is diligently working his way through a scroll sawing skill building tutorial. He's making headway. We've seen what he could do with his "entry level" saw so we should see some more intricate pieces shortly....possibly another heirloom quality chess set.



Vic McDonald: Vic wanted to stay "on game" after the holidays. So, so he took up the challenge of making a couple of spiral ornaments with floating banners inside.
