Russ Marie: brought a cross made with a scrollsaw, he used patterns from a woodworking magazine. He made it from maple.





A.J. Gatzemeyer explained his process for making the zig zag boxes he showed the previous meeting. Needless to say, getting perfect results requires relentless consistency in cutting the pieces. A.J. utilized few jigs to achieve perfect cuts and glue ups. He improvised a hinge system in place of what Rockler sells (lots \$\$\$). He was inspired to make the boxes from Wood Magazine (11/16). He used an 18tpi Timberwolf bandsaw blade.
