Russ Marie: used his scroll saw to create crosses that he's going to donate for a sale at his church. Also brought a scroll saw puzzle in the shape of a frog, painted John Deere green!

Lee Gatzmeyer: Lee brought a couple of puzzles he made. He used plans from a book he picked up a while ago.





Vic McDonald: made an "Elizabeth" name (after his son's girlfriend) out of wood and decorated with it purple flowers.

A J Gatzmeyer: brought a bunch of boxes that he called "razzle dazzle". The boxes were made from different materials (such as pine, walnut and cherry) and featured different techniques including a checkered board top.





Jim Doering: brought a box as well, a maple and walnut jewelry box for his grand daughter. Jim told a lovely story about his grand daughter who live in St. Louis.

Darrell Moore: Darrell was kind enough to build a box urn for a neighbor who was grieving over a lost dog.

Louis Knife: brought few boxes: a recipe box he made for Roger (with hand carved name on the lid), a jewelry box he made for his daughter 30 years ago with a hand carved burst pattern that was passed to his grand daughter. A third box that was made from walnut with an unknown material for the top.
