Mike Brown: Mike brought a double pegged tenon, part of the joint challenge. Mike spent 4 hours in making the joint.

Steve Hayes: was given the "knuckle" joint. Used a variety of techniques to make the joint, including ripping and gluing the pieces to get the desired design.





Tim Wilcoxen: made a wedged mortise and tenon. To make the deep mortise, Tim ripped the board in half, made the halves of the tenon and glued them back.

Khaled Mohammad: brought a half lap dovetail as a part of the joint challenge.


Tom Robertson: Tom brought a small case he made using the joint challenge. He was assigned a rabbet dovetail joint.



Tom Daughtry: brought a half lap dovetail joint, another joint he made while attending Marc Adams School of Woodworking.














Darrell Moore: got very creative with the joint he was working on. Ended up using it in a saw horse for his shop.



Mark Padesky: Mark brought back a cherry bowl he's been working on. He applied shellac to finish the bowl.




Denny Dukes: brought a wooden bass fish he made using the intarsia technique he mastered. He used lots of species of wood to reach the desired effect.
