Steam Bending

Larry Coggins


Larry needed a rocker to repair an oak rocking chair and put together a home-built steam bending process. Pictures on next page.

His process included building a box to hold the piece from plywood and created a steam generator using an old turkey fryer.

Once steamed (1-1/2") oak for 2 hours) the piece was put into a fixture using a heavy metal caul and some pretty stout clamps.

Bent to the basic shape Larry went to hand tools (spokeshave and files and I'm thinking a lot of sandpaper) to finish the process and it appears that the results were far more than adequate.

Thanks for taking the time to put this together and I'm sure you have inspired more than one of us. Great job!!



















Carl Miller

John brought in a "kite string spool" turning he did. It can be used with a cordless drill to wind in a lot of string in a short time.


John Freimuth But... John also brought in a "not so woodworking item. The Ultimate conduit blow gun.

Tom also brought in an urn he made using cedar and I believe purple heart. Another thoughtful and beautiful piece. Well done, Tom.


Russ Marie Russ brought in one of the balusters he built for a customer. Not the easiest of processes.


Vic McDonald


