




Table Saw Blades

Vic wins the award for the largest "Birdhouse" this month. His is a Wood Duck house made with rough sawn cedar







While Tim brought in a butterfly house from recycled wood for this month, he also brought in the TP holder he built for last months theme. Great job on both!!






Bill Frerking

Larry Truckenmiller


Larry built the small backyard shed that has been a hangout for grandkids over the years with its own little mailbox.

That's serious repurposing!!




